Presented by *CHILD FIRST/FINDING WORDS—NEW JERSEY*, an initiative of the Zero Abuse Project's Child Protection Training Center and the New Jersey Task Force on Child Abuse and Neglect in conjunction with New Jersey Children's Alliance.

FINDING WORDS can be difficult for a child victimized by abuse. Conflicting emotions of fear and love for the perpetrator may cause a child to be reluctant to reveal abuse. If a child tries to speak of abuse, he or she may lack the verbal skills to adequately communicate the event to an adult.

FINDING WORDS can be difficult for a police officer, social worker or prosecutor who must speak to a child about abuse. In order to communicate competently with a child, the interviewer must be able to speak in a manner consistent with the child's linguistic and developmental abilities.

FINDING WORDS can be difficult for a child forced to tell a jury about abuse.

FINDING WORDS can be difficult for an investigator or prosecutor forced to defend an interview from an attack by defense counsel that the child was "led" into making a false accusation.

CHILD FIRST/FINDING WORDS is an intensive five-day training course in which students learn the necessary skills to conduct a competent investigative interview of a child abuse victim using the ChildFirst forensic interview process.

CHILD FIRST/FINDING WORDS is an interactive course, which combines lectures with demonstrations and hands-on experience. Students will be required to interview a child about a non-abuse event and be critiqued by an expert forensic interviewer. Students will also conduct a 30-minute interview with an actor playing the role of an abused child and will be critiqued on their performances.

CHILD FIRST/FINDING WORDS is the ideal course for child welfare investigators, law enforcement, mental health clinicians and prosecutors seeking to enhance their ability to speak to and for abused children.

CHILD FIRST/FINDING WORDS—NEW JERSEY is a course taught by faculty trained and certified by the Zero Abuse Project's National Child Protection Training Center in St. Paul, Minnesota.

FORENSIC INTERVIEWER

This classification identifies law enforcement, forensic interviewers, assistant prosecutors, and child protection workers (Division of Child Protection and Permanency; Institutional Abuse) that conduct interviews of children for both criminal and family court matters. They will be responsible for attending all 5 days of investigative training, they will both conduct and provide feedback for the actor and child interviews and must successfully complete the written exam.

OBSERVER

This classification includes mental health providers, victim advocates and medical personnel that provide services for children that are victims of abuse. They will be responsible for attending all 5 days of training; they will observe and provide feedback for the actor and child interviews and must successfully complete the written exam.

UPDATE TRAINING

This classification includes forensic interviewers that were previously trained in Child First/Finding Words prior to 2014 and have never attended an update training course. Applicants must provide a copy of their Finding Words certificate attached to this application.

1. Forensic interviewers that will be actively conducting forensic interviews of children must complete the entire 5-day training. On page 5, please check off “**Forensic Interviewer**”.
2. Supervisors that will be observing/supervising forensic interviews must attend:
 - a. The second day of training to observe the instruction on the forensic interview protocol.
 - b. The fourth day of training to observe the forensic interview protocol during the actor interviews.

On page 5, please check off “**Updated training**” for this option.

Upon successful completion of the training, certificates will be awarded to all.

Dear Applicant:

Thank you for your interest in FINDING WORDS/CHILD FIRST– NEW JERSEY. Please take a few moments to read through this important information regarding the application process and attendance.

Each training is limited by COVID-19 compliant numbers. Zero Abuse Project’s Child Protection Training Center (ZAP) supports a multidisciplinary approach to child abuse cases. **Registration will be confined to those who attend the training as a Multidisciplinary Team (MDT). At a minimum, a team consists of a Prosecutor, a Forensic Interviewer and/or Child Abuse Detective/Investigator, and a Division of Child Protection and Permanency Child Protective Specialist (Intake Investigator).** Each team must indicate a contact person. This individual will be notified of the status of the applications approximately six weeks before the training. If you are accepted as a participant, and are unable to attend, you **MUST** find a replacement of the same discipline. If you are unable to find a replacement, the entire team may lose its slot, and it will be offered to a team on the waiting list.

Please be aware that this is an intensive course and **attendance is mandatory at every session**. Pre-course reading materials will be mailed prior to the training. The training sessions are supplemented with homework assignments, which must be completed each night. Each student will be given a written examination at the end of the course. Students who fail to participate in all workshops, complete homework assignments, complete a successful mock interview, or pass the examination will not be awarded a certificate of course completion. It is a rigorous week; however, we assure you that you will benefit from attendance.

Tuition (\$600) for this course is paid for by a grant from the New Jersey Task Force on Child Abuse and Neglect. Continental breakfast, lunch and snacks will be served throughout the week.
